#### **School Council Financials** -Marc

\* A meeting was requested by WRDSB Finance to explore any external bank accounts across the Board. At Preston, this meeting was held on Monday and the message was that ours (the OLG/Bingo account) would be consolidated with all other accounts beginning in September 2025. This is to increase accountability and to ensure that the school is not exposed to any fiscal vulnerabilities. While it will still appear separately, it will be accessible in our Finance portal called K212.

- > \$60 dollar cost for the purchase of 15 books or \$100 for a set of English and French books. Decision was made to purchase the bilingual selection
- > Additional volunteers should reach out to Lindsay W. or Jessica
